



Detroit-Warren-Livonia, MI

- Through the first half of 2007, the Detroit-Warren-Livonia metropolitan area was the fifth largest export market in the U.S., with sales totaling \$24.3 billion.
- The Detroit metropolitan area accounted for 73 percent of Michigan's merchandise exports in the first half of 2007.
- Canada was the leading export destination for Detroit's exports of goods in the first half of 2007. Other leading destinations were Mexico and Saudi Arabia.
- In the first half of 2007, Detroit benefited from existing free trade agreements, exporting \$18.2 billion to Canada and Mexico and \$71 million to the Central America and the Dominican Republic region.
- Seventy-five percent of Detroit's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
- Transportation equipment was the top Detroit export for the first half of 2007, accounting for \$16.7 billion, or 69 percent, of exported goods.
- Other top exports were machinery manufactures (\$2.0 billion, 8 percent); computer and electronic products (\$1.2 billion, 5 percent); and electrical equipment, appliances and components (\$1.0 billion, 4 percent).
