



New York-Northern New Jersey-Long Island, NY-NJ-PA

- In the first half of 2007, the New York-Northern New Jersey-Long Island, NY-NJ-PA metropolitan area was the largest export market in the U.S., with sales totaling \$39.7 billion.
- Canada was the leading export destination for New York's exports of goods in the first half of 2007. Other leading destinations were the United Kingdom and Japan.
- In the first half of 2007, New York benefited from existing free trade agreements, exporting \$6.5 billion to Canada and Mexico and \$548 million to the Central America and the Dominican Republic region.
- Sixteen percent of New York's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
- Miscellaneous manufactured commodities was the top New York export category for the first half of 2007, accounting for \$7.4 billion, 19 percent, of exported goods.
- Other top exports were chemicals (\$6.4 billion, 16 percent), primary metal manufacturing (\$5.3 billion, 13 percent), and computer and electronic products (\$3.2 billion, 8 percent).
