



San Francisco-Oakland-Fremont, CA

- San Francisco-Oakland-Fremont, CA was the eleventh largest metropolitan exporter in the United States in the first half of 2007, with exports totaling \$10.0 billion.
- In the first half of 2007, the metropolitan area of San Francisco-Oakland-Fremont, CA was the third largest metropolitan area exporter in California (behind Los Angeles-Long Beach-Santa Ana and San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara), with 14 percent of California's total merchandise exports.
- Canada, Japan, and China were among the leading export destinations for San Francisco's exports of goods in the first half of 2007.
- In the first half of 2007, San Francisco benefited from existing free trade agreements, exporting \$1.9 billion to Canada and Mexico and \$77 million to the Central America and the Dominican Republic region.
- Nineteen percent of San Francisco's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
- With \$3.5 billion in exports in the first half of 2007, computer and electronic products were the top export for the metropolitan area of San Francisco-Oakland-Fremont, CA, representing 35 percent of the area's total merchandise exports.
- Other export categories ranking among the area's top five were chemicals (\$1.8 billion, 18 percent); machinery, except electrical (\$1.2 billion, 12 percent); transportation equipment (\$592 million, 6 percent); and petroleum and coal products (\$466 million, 5 percent).
