



San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara, CA

- In the first half of 2007, the San Jose-Sunnyvale-Santa Clara metropolitan area was the seventh largest export market in the U.S., with sales totaling \$13.9 billion.
- The San Jose metropolitan area accounted for 20 percent of California's merchandise exports in the first half of 2007.
- South Korea was the leading export destination for San Jose's exports of goods in the first half of 2007. Other leading destinations were Japan and China.
- In the first half of 2007, San Jose benefited from existing free trade agreements, exporting \$1.4 billion to Canada and Mexico and \$45 million to the Central America and the Dominican Republic region.
- Ten percent of San Jose's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
- Computer and electronic products was the top San Jose export category for the first half of 2007, accounting for \$9.1 billion, or 65 percent, of exported goods.
- Other top exports were machinery, except electrical (\$3.4 billion, 24 percent); electrical equipment, appliances, and components (\$374 million, 3 percent); and chemicals (\$209 million, 1 percent).
